Special Features

Established in July, 1999, the philosophy of the Medicine Shoppe program is aimed at creating a capacity for change both within and outside this practice setting. The goal of the Medicine Shoppe Pharmacy program is to enable a pharmacy graduate to prepare for community pharmacy practice at an advanced level. Specifically, the program's intent is to provide the resident a structured learning environment for personal and professional growth, enabling the resident to: provide direct patient care in a community pharmacy; implement change in pharmacies with a traditional practice style; assist other pharmacists in developing pharmacy patient care skills; and understand a pharmacist's role within a community. The majority of the resident's time will be spent in the two Medicine Shoppe Pharmacies. The resident will also assist in the teaching of the pharmacotherapy lab for 2nd and 3rd year Doctor of Pharmacy students. Additional experience will include community outreach programs—asthma/diabetes/hypertension/lipid clinics and collaborative patient care initiatives—at the Two Rivers Clinic. Completion of a comprehensive project, including a formal presentation, is required for residency completion, and a substantial amount of time will be allocated for this.

Fringe Benefits

As an employee of the University of Wisconsin, the resident has access to certain benefits including health and liability insurance. Time allowed away from work includes 7 major holidays, 2 personal days (3 days accrue upon gaining Wisconsin pharmacy license), 10 days of approved professional leave per year, cognitive service revenue-sharing, UW faculty status (clinical instructor), and education/travel allowances.

The Two Rivers Medicine Shoppe Pharmacies have been recognized on a state and national level for their innovative practice characteristics. First, the use of technology to enhance patient instruction and care documentation is unique. Second, facility design/workflow have served as prototypes for the profession. Finally, reimbursement systems for pharmacy patient care have been developed to sustain this practice model. With experiences designed to mesh with these unique practice sites, this residency program is structured to develop leaders. Upon completion, the resident is prepared to develop his or her own practice or reengineer an existing practice.
