Business Member Spotlight: Dr. Jessica Benjamin, SSM Health St. Mary's Hospital

SSM Health is a Catholic, not-for-profit health system and integrated delivery network that delivers care throughout Illinois, Missouri, Oklahoma, and Wisconsin. SSM Health St. Mary's Hospital (Madison, Wisconsin) is a 400-bed community hospital and one of 23 hospitals in the health system. The mission of SSM

evolved over time, and she now is the regional manager of quality and safety for the Wisconsin region (which includes seven SSM Health hospitals). In her new role, she works with the vice president of pharmacy services and pharmacy directors to advance the pharmacy practice model and promote medication safety. She believes

medication-related events and presents the findings to the medication safety committee. When a safety incident arises, Benjamin frequently questions whether an underlying systemic cause exists, and considers retrospective solutions to prevent the event from occurring again. Tables and figures

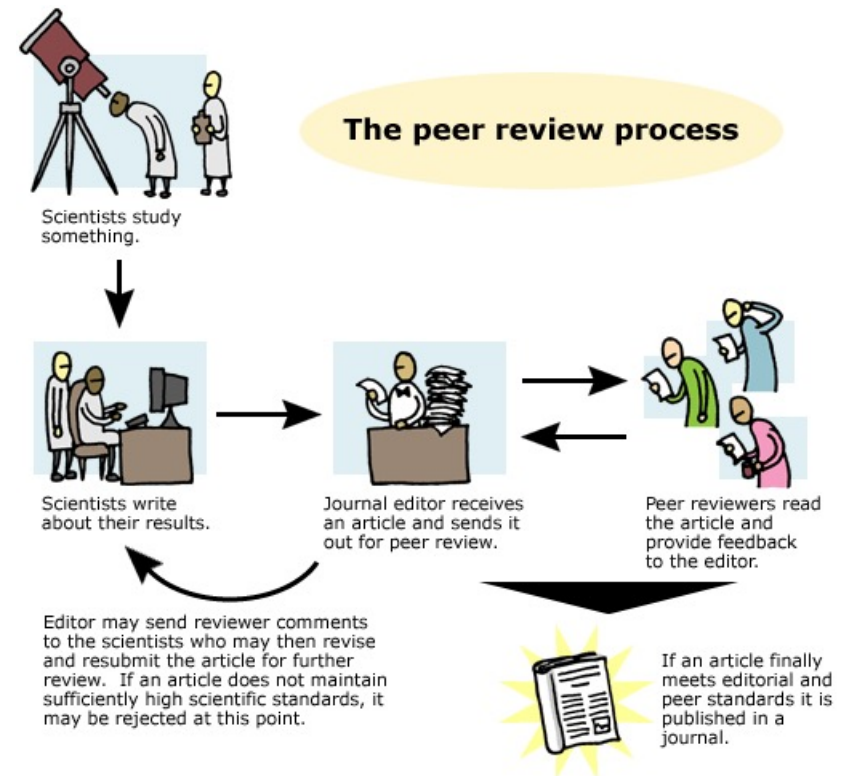
- Need permissions and abbreviations

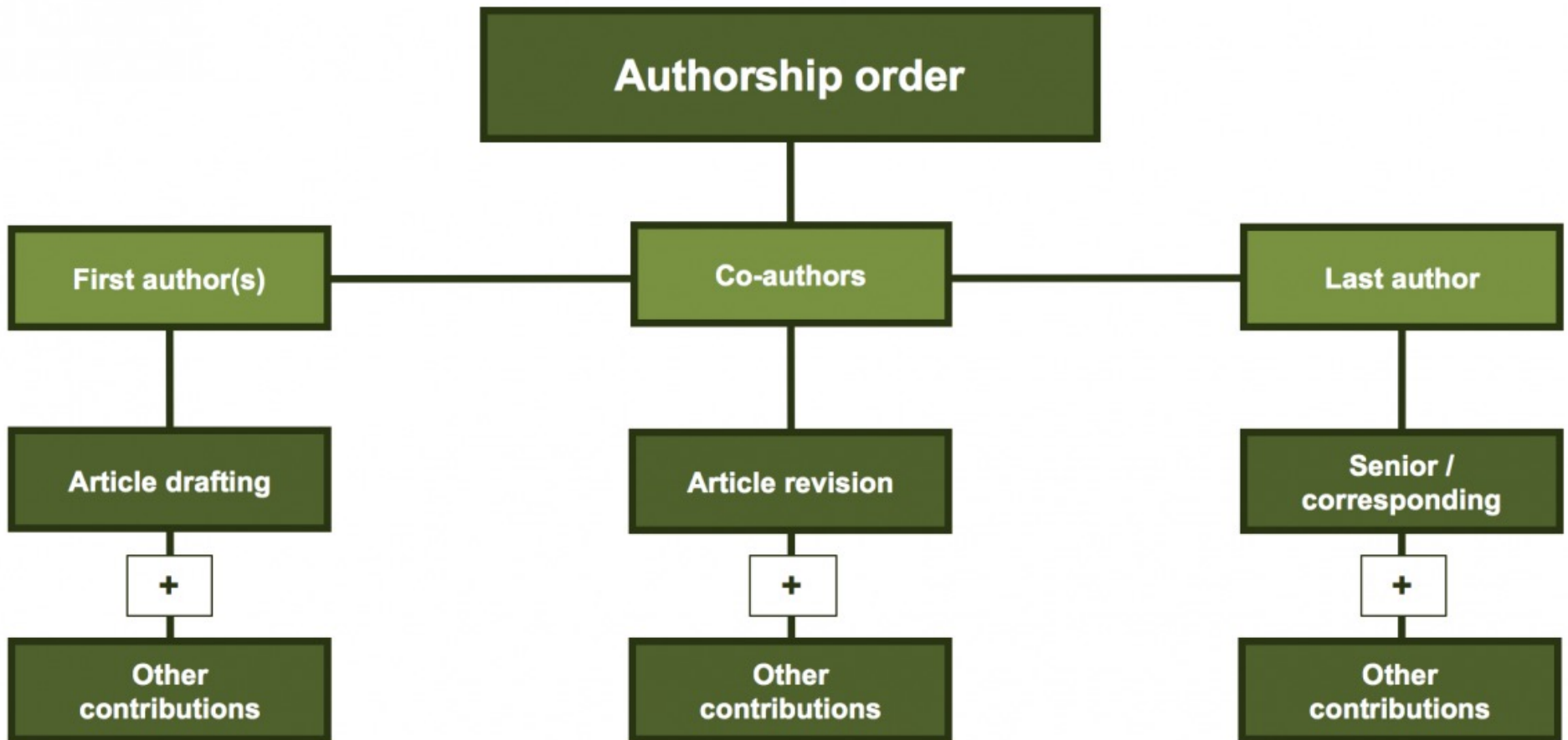
