

## **PHARMACY VACCINE AUTHORITY**

2021 Wisconsin Act 3

Prior to 2/20/21



Effective 2/20/21

#### Which students can administer immunizations?

Enrolled students who have completed their second year of pharmacy school and have completed 12 hours of vaccination training



Any enrolled student that has completed 12 hours of vaccination training

#### Who can supervise a pharmacy student immunizer?

A pharmacist who has completed vaccination training



Any healthcare provider whose scope includes vaccination. If a pharmacist, the pharmacist must be immunization trained.

#### Which pharmacy technicians can administer immunizations?

Under temporary pandemic allowances, certified and vaccine and CPR or BLS trained technicians can administer vaccinations.



Permanently, certified and vaccine and CPR or BLS trained technicians can administer vaccinations.

# Who can supervise a pharmacy technician immunizer?

A pharmacist who has completed vaccination training (for technicians immunizing under temporary pandemic allowances).



A pharmacist who has completed vaccination training.

### What training is required for technician immunizers?

PTCB or NHA certification, 2 hours of training and CPR or BLS certification is required.



PTCB or NHA certification, 2 hours of training and CPR or BLS certification is required.

Can pharmacy professionals administer injectable epinephrine or diphenhydramine in the case of an adverse vaccine interaction?

Yes, with a protocol or patient-specific prescription and completion of non-vaccine injection training.



Yes, if vaccine trained. No protocol or patient-specific prescription is required. No additional training required beyond vaccine training.
